MEMBERS' CONTRIBUTIONS

Charlotte and Jeremy's Canal Wharf Layout part 2

We have reached the stage of nearcompletion on the canal wharf layout. The area has been named 'Elizabeth Wharf' – Charlotte's middle name and most of the scenery is now in place. It is now a case of putting in little details and trying to populate the layout.

Ballasting is now complete. I was hoping to use Chinchilla bathing dust (or sand) but initially I had trouble



finding any so I used bird sand, which is a little coarse in reality. Using a blend of acrylic paint I toned the ballast down to a certain extent and the colour is not unlike the colour Edgar used when weathering the ballast on Gibben Quarry. As the station and wharf are meant to be in a run down condition, I used green scatter material to represent weeds on the track in several places and used black paint to colour the area around the coal bins.



The station platform is a pack of Peco edging covered in mounting board and I have used Scalescenes downloadable paper to surface it. The shed/hut on the platform is a Ten Commandments product painted up in about 4 different colours. A lot of the usual features are either Ratio or Peco.

I had obtained, through Rodney, some building kits; I have modified two to make low relief buildings for the street and then used some mounting board to create the flat roofed café and shop. Charlotte was insistent that we had a café so it is called Charlotte's Café.

A house move has intervened and stopped progress although, at the time of writing, the layout is in situ in the combined Railway Room/office/dressing room.



I have some people to paint up to add plus a signal to build and install. I shall be adding some scrub/bushes and some trees as finance permits and hope also to experiment with static grass in one or two areas. As I said in the first article, this is a test bed and practice piece for a bigger project. For about 3 weeks the layout resided in a friends garage and a little of the paper and card has suffered slightly but all is repairable.

Operationally the layout is goods only. When I was first building it I used my autocoach and 64xx to start a passenger service but now I have choked the platform with weeds and run just freight. The runaround loop holds 4 wagons and a brake van, which is just about right. If I built the layout again, for interest I would probably add more sidings and have a 3 road fiddle yard rather than 2 roads. I can now pop into the railway room, plug in and run a train when I feel like it.

In addition to various Facebook groups, I have been documenting the construction of the layout on 'N Gauge Forum' and was asked to try to get some 'waterline' shots from the canal.



What of the future? There are plenty of details to try my hand at but the next project is to build a small city terminus based around Cyril Freezer's Minories plan. This, as currently planned, would only have passenger facilities and would run into a cassette style of fiddle yard. It would sit on a row of IKEA storage units with the fiddle yard hanging over the end onto the landing. The aim would be to build to exhibition standards, have a set of suitable legs available and possibly an extension.
