We hope to bring him again to the club in 2017. He and his partner Anne have just moved house and hopefully this will encourage Mike to get back into N gauge modelling. ## CLUB LAYOUTS' NEWS

West Midlands N' Gauge Club 'on tour' 12th November West Bromwich open day, in Wednesbury Museum.

*Gibbons Quarry* took its first steps on the exhibition circuit with its first outing at the West Bromwich Model Railway Club open weekend, at Wednesbury museum. Whilst not yet complete it was amazing to hear some of the comments regarding the snow scene that had been created and how we had achieved a 'dirty snow' finish! A few old



buildings and vehicles were added to the layout to give it a bit of context.

We did get a number of favourable comments on what the layout was trying to do and for people to see how things are constructed.

With the number of isolating sections on the layout and not knowing where all sections were on the layout I just switched all the sections on; disconnected the controller and

connected the DCC controller much simpler to operate then. (This is the box on top of the layout in the picture).

A couple of minor changes to the back scene were required, as one brake van had a longer chimney stack on it which gets the whole train stuck; fortunately this was found out the night before and corrected on the day with a junior hacksaw!

Overall the layout worked well over the day and kept going. One minor hiccup the day before was that the points didn't work. On checking underneath one wire had come loose in the move just on the CDU. Otherwise on the day they all worked all day.

The tight corner at the bottom did limit the use of some locos due to its radius and a couple of locos has issues at the point where it went into the dead section. The section from this point to the station siding could be improved; as you could not leave a loco in the station and use the siding at the top.

# HERITAGE RAILWAYS Part One

The **S**evern **V**alley **R**ailway is a heritage railway in Shropshire and Worcestershire, England. The 16-mile (26 km) heritage line runs along the Severn Valley from Bridgnorth to Kidderminster, crossing and following the course of the River Severn



for much of its route. Train services are hauled predominantly by steam locomotives, however diesel is also used on designated days and during periods of high fire risk.

The railway is one of the most popular heritage railways in the country as well as being the sixthlongest standard gauge heritage line in the United Kingdom, it hosts

numerous special events throughout the year, including both steam and diesel galas.
