Obituary

It is with deep regret that we have to say that Alfred Hill [Alf] died on the 13th July this year. He was one of the founding members of the club when it started in 1995. He will be sadly missed by many of the club members.

He was born on the 11th December 1922 in Erdington, Birmingham. He left school at 14 and joined the Post Office. He served in the RAF during WW2. After a couple of different jobs, getting married and having two daughters, he went to work for Dunlop until he retired. For as long as anyone can remember he loved trains, but his interest in model railways began when the family used to go on holiday to his wife's cousin in Hereford. Her husband, who worked for British Rail, had a layout and Alf loved helping him and became hooked. He was pleased when his children left home and he was able to take over their bedroom for his layout. His other main interest was DIY especially woodworking.

Alf helped out at the club in many ways not only carpentry, but he came into his own when we moved to our current location in 2004. The room came with a large walk in store room, which became Alf's domain. He set about keeping it in a tidy and ordered fashion – something we don't really do anymore. Appearing for tea break, if he wasn't to be seen, we knew he was in the cupboard!

With failing eyesight he still managed to paint the houses at the town end of our layout "Waterstock", and these remain, as he had painted them all those years ago. As his eyesight became weaker he had to give up driving, and the club. He eventually moved to Huntingdon to be near one his daughters.

Recently he deteriorated quite quickly due to a combination of the stroke he suffered 18 months ago, a chest infection, which they didn't seem able to get on top, of and his age. It was quite peaceful he was not in any pain or discomfort, he slept a great deal and his body just shut down.

He spent the latter part of his life in a care home and his family read our club newsletter to him from the time. He went to Huntingdon until his passing. He once told me how important the newsletter was to him, telling him details about the layout and the members he had known.

We offer our sympathy to his family and friends: please take a moment to remember Alf – one of the nicest people and sadly another club member no longer with us.
